Dear Old Girls

Since I last wrote to you a lot has happened at school. As well as settling in to the new joint LES Music School and benefiting from its fabulous facilities we have just recently taken possession of our new Drama Studio and four new classrooms at LHS. These have been created out of the old music school and we hope that they will provide spacious accommodation for the English and Social Science departments. All the classrooms are equipped with new furniture, laptops, and data projectors. The Drama studio itself has been kitted out with retractable tiered seating (the generous gift of our Parents' Association) and lighting and effects box, as well as changing areas. All of this will benefit not only our talented group of AS Theatre Studies students but all the pupils in years 7-9 who now take Drama as part of the taught curriculum, in addition to those who take part in drama clubs and the annual House drama competition which is held at the end of the summer term.

We are currently looking forward to the official opening of the LES Music School, which will be named the Tomlinson Building, after the former chair of governors Philip Tomlinson who has served the schools tirelessly over the last years as a governor and who was the driving force behind the planning and building of this joint venture. The official opening will take place on Wednesday March 13th by Sir Peter Maxwell Davies, in charge of the Queen's music, and we hope that a full report of this will be available soon after on our web site which is currently in the process of being updated.

As hoped the new Music School has introduced new ideas to the campus for musical activities and the first of these was the enormously enjoyable joint concert held at Loughborough Town Hall last November. We are now looking forward to the joint choral concert of Vivaldi's Gloria which will be held at Loughborough Parish Church on Saturday 24 March at 7pm. The choir will include boys and girls from both schools as well as staff, old girls and boys, and parents. Anyone interested in attending this concert should contact Tania Moore at LES Music School about the availability of tickets. A joint ball to mark the opening of the building has been planned by the three parents' Associations and is already sold out.

Work is currently in process to examine the possibility of enhancing the science facilities at LHS and adding more labs and a more extensive prep area. So we hope that this will be the next important focus of development for the school which prides itself on its scientific reputation and success. However we are aware of the need to plan sympathetically, environmentally and as economically as possible so the project will take us time!

Away from the physical aspects of the school I am pleased to report that academically the school continues to thrive, with six students offered places for next year to study at Oxford and Cambridge and many others in receipt of offers to study at a range of universities in their chosen subjects.

The Y12 team which took part in the national Question Time competition, organised by the BBC in conjunction with the Question Time programme, has been very successful in reaching the final twelve teams (from over one hundred) and they will host their own version of Question Time on Thursday March 12th in the main school hall.

Similarly the school has enjoyed great success again in the national netball competition with three teams, the U14, U16, and the U18, reaching the national finals in Bournemouth on Saturday March 17th. This is no small achievement for a

school rather than a netball club and demonstrates the determination, dedication and talent not only of the team players but also their coaches, our teachers.

Other events which have been enjoyed this term include the Y11 end of mock exams treat at Self Esteem day, where there was the opportunity to learn jewellery making skills, have beauty treatments, take part in salsa dancing and box-ercise, a visit to the Houses of Parliament escorted by our local MP, Andy Reed, for our Y12 politics group, numerous theatre trips for all ages, a visit to the Beth Shalom museum to meet a holocaust survivor, many charity events ranging from a Y8 disco to a talent contest, as well as the now traditional red rose delivery between the three schools for Valentine's Day in aid of Amnesty.

We have of course also been busy with the selection process for a new generation of Loughborough High pupils and it is especially good to have met so many old girls through recent months and weeks as they have attended Open Mornings, informal visits to the school and finally entrance exam day itself. I look forward to meeting them again in June at our induction day for new pupils and would urge them to get actively involved with the Old Girls' association which is always in need of new members who can give a little time and creative energy to the Committee and its activities. Please do not hesitate to contact either Jenny Woods (Secretary of the OGA) or me through the main administration office. We would be pleased to hear from you.

Finally I would really like to make another 'plug' for the old girls' website which currently is being updated. This is a fabulous opportunity but to make it really work it does require you to send in your news and information so that it can go on there, as well as details of any year group reunions you have planned. This information can be sent either in the form of snail mail or email to the school- admin@loughhs.leics.sch.uk . We also urge you to send in any changes of addresses increasingly we are having mail returned to us from addresses on our data base. Ideally we would hope to be able to transfer to a mostly electronic form of communication with you to save on postage (but don't panic - this will not happen overnight and no-one will be missed out!).

Finally I would like to say a huge thank you to all the Committee for their hard work on numerous projects connected with the OGA and especially to Jenny Woods who spends a lot of time on the website and on updating information, an invaluable role.

Mrs Joyce Cross (née Simon), who died in Sheffield on January 18th 2007, was a former member of staff from the late 1940s until her marriage in 1965. She was a valued colleague in the Modern Languages department, teaching French and German. Two of her friends and former colleagues were able to join the family at St. Colomba's Church, Sheffield for her funeral.
