2005 London Dinner

As usual, the members who attended this event said that they very much enjoyed the chatting and reminiscing in the congenial surroundings of the RAF Club in central London. After an enjoyable meal a presentation was made to Jim Crookes (1988-2005) on his appointment as Deputy head of Welbeck College after seventeen years as geography Master and head of geography at the Grammar School. In his presentation, John Weitzel (1978 -) asked members present to say in what school trips they had participated during their days at school. He did this to stress their extremely ambitious nature and the success of the many expeditions to many countries which Jim has led

during his years at Loughborough. An example of this was the trekking expedition to Nepal in 1993. On the way to the base camp of Everest they met Sir Edmund Hillary, presenting £4,000 worth of medical and education equipment for the local hospital and school. Jim replied with his own memories.

The downside of the occasion was the reduction in numbers. There were only 47 OLs which is the lowest number we have ever had at the RAF Club. We were missing several of our usual table groups organised by certain faithful members. We really do rely on a number of you to take the initiative and persuade friends and contemporaries to join you at these reunions. The London Dinner was originally initiated for the large number of members living in and around London. There must be far more in that category now than ever before. A good number of us still travel to the dinner from Loughborough and elsewhere in the country.

If any member has a suggestion for ensuring the continued success of these events it would be helpful to let us know. The charges at the RAF Club are reasonable for London but we only managed to maintain the price of £45.00 per head by limiting the "free bar" before the meal to a single drink (not easy to organise). We do of course include the (generous) dinner wines and port within the price. We could consider the more moderately priced menus of those offered by the Club if price is seen as a significant factor in attendance.

Next year's dinner is booked at the Club for Friday 13th October 2006 and the second Friday in October is pencilled in for the following two years.

Nearly 180 Old Boys, Old Girls, LES staff and their partners enjoyed a fantastic evening at the Bonfire Ball, which was organised by the OGA for past pupils of both schools. The Deputy Mayor of Charnwood opened the evening which consisted of a delicious four course meal accompanied by jazz from Opus 3, a charity auction, a professional firework display and a disco until 1am. During the meal close-up magic was performed at the tables and afterwards guests had caricatures drawn. The general consensus was that the evening was "fabulous".

The Bonfire Ball also raised a considerable amount of money for charity. The British Red Cross (Leicestershire and Rutland Branch) was the beneficiary of the auction which raised £1,049, including a donation of £80 after the auction to take the proceeds over the £1,000 mark. The raffle raised £111 for Epilepsy Action in memory of Helena Robinson (LHS 1992-1999) who died from an epileptic fit earlier this year.
