Annual Meeting High

The 5th Annual Meeting of the Old Girls' Association, was held at the School on Friday Jan. 1st.

Annual General

The Annual General meeting of the Association was held at School on Nov. 8th 1923.

The President - Miss Bristol was in the chair & there were present about 40 old girls - which was a very satisfactory attendance considering the bad weather. Refreshments were served before the business began.

The President asked the Secretary to read the minutes of the last General meeting & the Report of the Year's work.

The next item on the agenda concerned the Prize offered by the Association & it was proposed & seconded that 'this be given annually to the Head of the School.'

The question of Rules of the Association next arose. A draft of rules had been prepared by the Committee & copies of these were given to all members present for discussion. Each rule was discussed in order, & various points altered - the final draft

being as follows.

1. Title. The club shall be called the Loughborough H. S. Old Girls Association.
2. Eligibility. The following shall be eligible for membership - Head Mistresses, Past Head mistresses, Past & present members of Staff. All old girls & members of Form VI.
3. Officers. The officers of the Assoc. shall consist of President (who shall be the Headmistress) Vice President, Secretary, Treas, Catering Sec, + 12 members of Committee - of whom 1 shall represent the staff + 1 the girls who have just left school. There shall also be a representative on the Magazine Committee.
4. Any member shall have the right to propose a new rule or alteration of a rule at the General meeting. As far as possible the Sec. shall be notified of such alteration a fortnight before the meeting.
5. Meetings. The meetings shall be as notified on the membership cards - The Annual Gen Meeting to be 1st Thurs. in November.

The Annual Summer Meeting, 1st Sat. in July
is fixed for the last day of Winter Term.
6 Subscriptions (a) Annual Subs. shall
fall due on Nov 1st - to be paid at the
Annual Meeting (if possible).

b. The Sub: to be 1/- per annum
A member may become a Life Member on
payment of £1. 1-0.

c. Any member whose subscription has
lapsed for 2 years shall cease to belong to
the Club but shall again become a
member on payment of her current subscription
together with an entrance fee of 1/-.

7. Change of Address. Members shall notify
the Secretary immediately.

After these had been discussed
elections took place for the vacancies on
the Committee. The Secretary, & 5 members
having resigned.

Other business included —

1. Netball matches. It was decided to
arrange fixtures between present & old girls.
2. Teas at hockey & netball matches. It
was arranged to have tea after the matches;
the School & the O.G.A. to provide alternately.
3. An explanation by the Sec: as to the method
of obtaining O.G.A. blazers. Each member
to obtain her own using a letter (authorising
her to do so) signed by 'the Sec.'
4. The accounts were audited by Miss
Bristol & passed.
5. A request from the Sec. of the Cuppies
Guild that the O.G.A. should provide an
entertainment for the members was acceded
to. The Committee to make 'necessary'
arrangements. Miss Bristol kindly
offered the use of the School Hall.
This finished the business & a short
programme of music followed.

Annual General

The question as to whether the weekly badminton should be continued or not next arose. As the attendance had been poor in the past, members wishing to play were asked to give in their names. As the number of entries for the same was reasonably large, it was

decided that the game should be continued. It was arranged that the Old Girls' Association should once more entertain the members of the Bipples' Guild and that this event should take place towards the end of the Spring Term.

Miss Gandon had kindly agreed to instruct members of the O.G.A. in Folk Dancing and Gymnastics, so these ^{classes} were arranged to take place on Friday evenings from 8.-9.30 p.m. starting in the Spring Term. The evenings for the same were to be divided up with $\frac{1}{4}$ hour for each of the activities. The Sports Captain received entries for these and it was hoped that still more would be received on the day of the Winter Reunion.

The question as to whether an Old Girls' Hockey Club should be formed was left for discussion at the Winter Reunion.

The Annual General meeting this year was a very short one. The usual business having been transacted previously as far as possible.

This was due to the fact that the School Jubilee was being celebrated at the same time.

A great many old girls were present of all generations. Miss Bristol presided & the Secretary read a short report of the Year's work - thanking all those who had helped on the various committees & announcing that there was a balance of £7. 1s. 3d. in hand.

The committee were re-elected en bloc. This closed the business meeting.
