## SPORT REPORTS

### Badminton

Four boys represented LGS at the first round of the Leicestershire Championships. Whilst it is a Key Stage 3 competition, in which most boys are Year 9, LGS took three Year 7 boys and one Year 9 boy. Joshua T, Ibthiha O, Max Z and Jaden D played against four local schools with the matches being a combination of singles and doubles. The most any school scored against LGS was five and we won all four matches meaning the LGS Key Stage 3 badminton team won the **Leicestershire County Finals** and became county champions!

Our **U14** and **U16** badminton teams progressed to the next round of the **National Badminton Championships** by winning the County rounds in both age groups. This competition was hosted for the first time at Loughborough Grammar School and the team played with high levels of intensity as we overcame Manor High School and Crown Hills Community College in both singles and doubles matches. The boys won 5-0, 4-1 and 4-1.

The **senior boys'** team, Dani A H, Hugo S, Cheng P and Thibault C, won the team Leicestershire Key Stage 5 competition, winning every match and losing very few points.

Our LHS Key Stage 3 Badminton team consisting of Sofia, Amber, Rosie, and Bella competed in the Team Leicestershire County **Badminton Finals**. Unbeaten until the final, the girls lost out on the gold medal to an excellent Rushey Mead team. However, the girls walked away with a silver medal and a very commendable **second place** finish out of seven teams! Loughborough Grammar School Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 badminton teams travelled to the National Schools England Badminton Championships East Midlands Regional Finals.



This is the first time we have entered this competition and having won the county round convincingly, we were all looking forward to the next challenge.

The Key Stage 3 team showed their prowess from the first point. They won all three of their matches 5-0 with Joshua T and Ibthiha O performing superbly, winning all of their singles, despite a couple of very close matches. The matches are scored by points, and the team beat Oundle 105 - 72, Priory 105-55 and West Bridgford 105 - 80.

Not to be outdone by the younger team, the Key Stage 4 team, Marco C, Alex V, Demetrius C and Oscar H achieved some great results. Their first match was against QUEGS which was the closest of all of their matches, and with a tight doubles game they finished 3-2 winners with a 90-78 scoreline. After this there was no stopping the team as they continued to beat West Bridgford 105-42 and Oundle School 105-59 winning both matches 5-0. A special mention to Marco C who won all of his singles matches easily throughout the day.

These amazing results mean that both Grammar School Teams are now Regional Champions and will progress to the **National Finals** at the National Badminton Centre next month.

We took eleven Year 8 and 9 girls to compete against schools from across the country. The day was very well organised, with our girls playing five 12-minute matches. They had a slow start, losing their first game, however some of the girls had never played with each other before and so it took a little bit of time to gel as a team. Once they got going, they looked unbeatable. They won their next four games and played some beautiful football in the process, leading to a second place finish. Overall, it was a great day out and they did themselves and the school proud. Some tough fixtures in the ESFA cup meant we didn't progress to the later rounds but with interest at a record high, the school is now in a good position to remain competitive for years to come.

Our new Head of Football, Mr Perry Wild, joins us after Easter and has many fresh ideas on how to advance football across the Foundation. This, alongside record engagement, ensures we should have a bright few years of football ahead of us.

- **U11 girls** were silver medallists in their IAPS plate competition and runners-up in their In2Hockey County Qualifier. This means the girls have qualified for the **Regional Finals** which were hosted at Rugby School.
- **U13 girls** finished their cup campaign as bronze medallists in the Independent Schools Hockey Competition following a very entertaining **Finals Day** at Beeston Hockey Club. The girls also finished their County Tournament as runners-up and took part in their **Regional Finals** where they performed superbly and were unbeaten all day. They will now progress to the **National Finals** after Easter. The girls have had another incredible season and will be looking to finish their season on a high.
- **U13 boys** went on their **Manchester Tour** during the February half-term break. 18 of our **U13** boys experienced a mixture of competitive fixtures and sightseeing, including a tour of Old Trafford stadium and visiting the Etihad stadium to watch a Premier League match.
- **U14 boys** came out on top of their County Qualifier meaning they qualified for the **Tier 2 U14 Regional Finals**. The boys played some very good hockey throughout the day and finished up in sixth place with three wins, one draw and two losses.
- **U14 girls** qualified for their Regional Tournament after battling their way through a County Tournament to end up as **winners**, and a Zone Competition where they finished as runners-up. The girls made it all the way to the **semi-final stage** of their regional round only to lose out narrowly to Ratcliffe College. This was a year of development for this group which ended with a lot of good results and team performances.

- **1XI girls** battled their way through to the **Tier 2 National semi-final**. The girls cup journey came to an end as they narrowly lost out to Perse School. It has been another great year for our **senior girls** who continue to push the standard of hockey for our school and put Loughborough High School on the map.
- **1XI boys** have had a wonderful comeback season under the new leadership of **Mr Willars**. The boys continue to make progress in their **Tier 2 Plate competition** and had a home tie against Scarborough. The boys will finish their season with a tour to **Holland** where they will experience playing and watching hockey in the country which is ranked top in the world for both men and women's hockey.

Overall, we are incredibly proud of all the efforts and achievements from our players this season and are looking forward to acknowledging some of these in the coming weeks and months during our sports awards evenings.

The whole triathlon club is preparing for many more triathlon events as the Summer term starts.

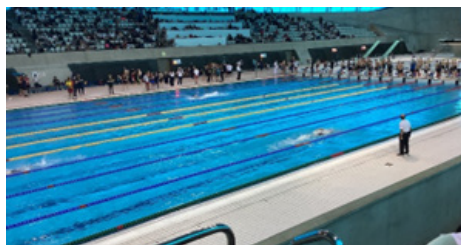


## Swimming and Triathlon

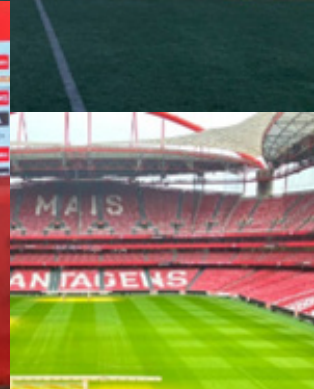


## SPORTS TRIPS AND TOURS

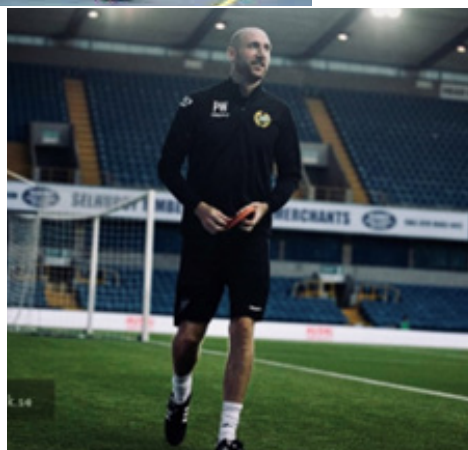


## Mr Perry Wild Head of Football

# SCHOLARSHIPS

We are delighted to share the news that Loughborough School Foundation will be offering sports scholarships to further enhance our sporting offer and experience. The scholarships will come into effect in September 2025, and will be offered following an application process as follows:

## Sporting Talent Award

- Available to pupils entering Year 7 (11+) or Year 8 (12+). We are looking for pupils who demonstrate evidence of athletic ability and the aptitude to work hard, demonstrating self-motivation and a clear desire to compete and strive for success. If you are applying for this award, you will have advanced physical competences and movement skills, and will benefit from a high level of coaching.
- Our Sporting Talent Award entitles the successful applicant to a single award of £500 to enhance their sporting experience.

## Sports Scholarship

There are two application points for our Sports Scholarships:

- Year 9 (13+) and Year 12 (16+)
- Recipients of the 13+ Scholarship would need to re-apply for the 16+ Scholarship in Year 12.
- The Sports Scholarship comes with a fee remission of up to 20%. The exact amount will be at the discretion of the Head of the relevant School in consultation with the Director of Sport, based on the individual's sporting ability and potential in the School's major team sports.

## Application and Assessment

We would welcome applications from a range of sporting disciplines but representation within the Foundation's major team sports will be favoured. If shortlisted for the Sporting Talent Award or Sports Scholarship, you would be invited to attend a scholarship interview day led by the Director of Sport and the Head of Performance Sport. This will involve time within your chosen School, taking part in sporting activities, and short interviews with staff. Additionally, shortlisted applicants for the 11+ awards should expect the interview day to focus on core skills, tactical awareness, and drivers of sporting potential.
