Football

The football teams across the four Schools have gone from strength to strength this year.

The Fairfield Girls' U11 team were not to be outdone and played brilliantly by winning the ISFA Regional rounds and qualifying for the National Finals at St George's Park after half-term. There have been record participation rates for both boys' and girls' football at the extracurricular clubs.

At the High School, the combined Year 10 and 11 football team has finished fifth in the Leicestershire Regional Futsal Finals. The U13 have played a high number of fixtures and interest is growing enabling them to field A and B teams next year.

Amherst School have performed brilliantly at the U13 futsal tournaments and regularly field Boys' and Girls' U13 teams.

The Grammar School teams have had a very positive record for the 2021/22 season. The first XI finished third in the inaugural ISFA Mercian League and the second XI finished second in the same league for second teams.





Rugby

The rugby teams have had a busy year. Highlights are the U15 and U16 teams both reaching the Leicestershire County Finals, as well as the U16 team achieving a near perfect season. Over 250 boys from Loughborough Grammar School have represented the School. We were delighted to see the return to the rugby tour weekends with the Year 7s visiting Blackpool, and Year 9s, South Wales and this year the Year 10s visited Wakefield and Scarborough. A huge 'thank you' to the staff for co-ordinating these trips.





Girls' Cricket

In our first year of playing in the indoor cricket competitions we finished as Leicestershire County Indoor Champions at both U13 and U15 as well as Regional Finalists in both age groups.

We have enjoyed a return to outdoor cricket fixtures and have seen great performances from everyone. All players have learnt so much from the indoor training which the girls have transferred into their outdoor game.

We are delighted to celebrate the success of Olivia at the High School, who has been selected for the Loughborough Lightning Cricket Elite Player Pathway.



After school sessions at Park Road are giving the girls an opportunity to use the nets and help with transition into

hardball cricket and as such, we are thrilled to be developing a strong link with Loughborough Town Cricket Club.



Boys' Cricket

After two years of very little cricket, we are now in full swing with 10 teams regularly playing Saturday fixtures alongside several midweek fixtures for all age groups.

Preparations for the season stared back in January with well attended winter nets in the sports hall. It was great to have Harry Gurney (England, Nottinghamshire and LGS alumnus) assist the teams with coaching over this period. The Year 7 and 10 boys played in the County Indoor Cricket tournaments with both teams losing narrowly in the final. Our Year 8s and 10s also enjoyed indoor fixtures at Trent College against the hosts and Repton School.

Over 130 boys have represented Loughborough Grammar School in the



first half of the Summer term. Joshua in Year 8 scored a magnificent 131 v Trent College in the first Saturday fixture of the year and has gone on to make his first XI debut, taking four wickets against local rivals Nottingham High School. Aryan, first XI Captain has also posted two fifties in the first two games. After school practises for all age groups are proving popular with the boys using the artificial net complex every evening during term time.

Cross Country and Athletics

In the range of competitions for crosscountry, highlights were individual performances from Olly and Jake (LGS Year 7) who both went on to represent the County.


The LGS Year 7 team finished second in the Leicestershire League Competition.

Athletics has been going well this term with more pupils across the Senior Schools training and competing together. Highlights so far have been the LGS team winning meets at Worksop College and Nottingham High School. With individual winning performances from Johan in the 200m, Josh in the 800m and Tom in the 1500m. In the field events Will won the Shot Putt and Javelin and Seb won the High Jump. The Grammar School team have also progressed to the Regional round of the National Schools Track and Field Cup next half-term.

At the Area Athletics Championships hosted at Quorn, there were some superb individual performances and many Foundation pupils have qualified to represent the district at the County Championships after half-term. Of note was that at U15, eight out of 10 events were won by LSF pupils. And in the Boys' competition the Grammar School won 10 out of 12 events at U15 and six out of 10 events at U13.

Badminton

The High School U13 team played brilliantly and having won the District tournament, they reached the County Finals earlier this term. Meanwhile the U18 Grammar School badminton team had an excellent tournament at the Leicestershire County Finals, they played 12 singles matches and six doubles matches, losing only one match in the entire tournament. This makes them Leicestershire County Champions.





Swimming and Triathlon

We are delighted that a Fairfield team has competed at the National IAPS Triathlon competition in Bath this year and Amherst pupils have competed at the National ISA Triathlon in Ipswich. For many this was their first triathlon and they finished in the middle of the National standings. It was a great starting point for all involved. We have the first round of the East Midlands Junior Triathlon series coming up and this will provide multiple racing opportunities across the summer in the Midlands.

In Swimming, Amherst have had three swimmers racing at National School level and Fairfield have enjoyed success at the National IAPS Swim Championships. Next week, we have the first Loughborough Schools Foundation swim team competing against Oundle School.

We have been pleased to develop Water Polo club this year and both Junior and Senior Triathlon clubs have grown in number with the Saturday and Sunday training sessions proving to be popular.









Basketball

The Grammar School U18 Basketball team represented the School at the Leicester Riders' Arena in the Team Leicestershire Finals having won several rounds to reach the Finals. They played brilliantly and finished Runners-up against very strong opposition, only losing by one point.

Our junior basketball teams have been training hard and the numbers attending the lunchtime clubs are high. We are growing this sport and looking forward to more fixtures later this term.





Modern Pentathlon and Biathlon

Congratulations go to Oliver in Year 7 at the Grammar School, who recently came second in the British Laser Run competition in Edinburgh. Oliver has now been invited to represent GB at a Laser Run International competition in Madeira in June and has been selected to compete for the European Championships in Athens in August.

Six pupils represented Loughborough Grammar School at the National Tetrathlon Championships. The pupils competed in swimming, fencing, laser gun shooting and running in three age categories, whilst all the boys competed recently in the Modern Biathlon Championships also held at Bath



Amherst and Loughborough University Tennis Programme

Our students from Amherst School who are part of the LUNTA programme have all be training hard and their efforts have been rewarded with superb results. At the U18 Nationals, Luca Pow (Year 12) won the boys tournament and became the U18 Boys National Champion. On the girls side it was an all LUNTA final with Mimi Xu (Year 10) playing Talia Neilson-Gatenby (Year 11). In a close fought match Mimi took the win 6-4, 7-5 to become U18 Girls National Champion. Both Luca and Mimi have now been rewarded with a wildcard to both the Wimbledon Seniors qualification rounds and the Wimbledon Juniors main draw. In addition, Talia as runner-up receives a Wimbledon Juniors main draw wildcard. In the boys doubles competition our players partnered up and Luca and Henry (Year 11) took the win to become **U18 Doubles National Champions**



At the U16 National Championships it was Henry Searle who won the final 6-4 6-4 to become the U16 Boys Singles Champion. He is now also rewarded with a Wildcard to Wimbledon Juniors Main Draw. Mimi backed up her U18s Nationals win with another successful week and title becoming the U16 Girls Singles Champion with a 6-3, 7-6 (5) win in the final. Mimi (with her partner from the GB National Academy in Stirling) is also the U16 Girls Doubles Champion.

Across the two weeks the Amherst tennis players won seven out of eight National Championships and won every competition entered by LUNTA, representing a clean sweep of titles. We look forward to following the progress of these players at the junior and senior qualifying for Wimbledon next month.

Meanwhile Ranah is preparing to play her first-round match in the main draw of Junior Roland Garros on Sunday. This is Ranah's third Junior Grand Slam event having competed in Wimbledon in 2021 and the US Open earlier this year. Ranah goes into the tournament currently ranked 40 in ITF World Juniors.
