## Statement of Aims

Our mission is to prepare young men for a fulfilling life through fostering achievement, aspiration and empathy.

We know boys and how to motivate them. We believe that high expectations are central to their success, helping to foster academic rigour and a love of learning for its own sake. We understand that a sense of achievement is also created through our hugely varied programme of extra-curricular activities which enable boys to feel fulfilled and to develop their character, resilience and teamwork.

The following five values underpin a Loughborough Grammar School education:

### Scholarship

We inspire our pupils to become intellectually curious, lifelong learners, who have the confidence to be innovative and unafraid of failure.

### Wellbeing

Grammar School boys grow into healthy young men with a sense of perspective. They are aware of the emotional wellbeing of others and talk about their concerns.

### Integrity

Our pupils learn to demonstrate good judgement in their decisions. The spirit of Loughborough Grammar School is characterised by constructive relationships between all members of our community based on the core value of treating others as we would like to be treated ourselves.

# Curriculum

## Year 6

All pupils follow a broad curriculum which includes English, Mathematics, Art, Computing, Drama, French, Games, Geography, History, Latin, Music, PE, PSHE, Science and Spanish.

## Year 7 and 8

All pupils follow a broad curriculum which includes English, Mathematics, Art, Biology, Chemistry, Computing, French, Games, Geography, History, Latin, Music, PE, PSHE, Physics and Religion and Philosophy.

In Year 8, pupils also study Design and Technology and Drama. They continue with French and choose another language (German or Spanish).

## Year 9

Pupils will continue with most of the subjects studied during Year 7 and 8, namely English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Computing, French, Games, German/Spanish, Geography, History, PE, Physics, PSHE and Religion and Philosophy.

Pupils also choose two additional subjects from Art, Classical Civilisation, Design and Technology, Drama, Greek, Latin and Music.

## Year 10 and 11

Pupils start the formal two-year GCSE or IGCSE courses. All boys take English Language, English Literature and Mathematics as compulsory subjects, and a further six subjects from the following list:

- Art and Design
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Classical Civilisation
- Computing
- Design and Technology
- Drama
- French
- Geography
- German
- Greek
- History
- Latin
- Music
- Physics
- Religious Studies
- Spanish

All boys study at least one Modern Foreign Language and two Sciences. We also recommend that boys take one humanity subject (Classical Civilisation, History, Geography or Religious Studies).

## Additional Information for International Pupils

### English as a Second Language (EAL)

All pupils starting at the School from overseas have an initial assessment carried out by a qualified EAL specialist and are given a level on the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) in speaking, listening, reading and writing.

They work intensively on speaking, listening, reading, writing and grammar and are further encouraged to participate actively in all curriculum areas by asking and answering questions in class and by engaging in whole class, small group and paired discussions.

### Years 7 to 11

Pupils identified as in need of English support are taught in small groups throughout the week.

In Years 7 to 11, pupils work towards the Cambridge English Exams at the following levels as appropriate:

- Key English Test (KET - A1/A2)
- Preliminary English Test (PET - B1)
- First Certificate in English (FCE - B2)
- Certificate of Advanced English (CAE - C1).



# Additional Information for International Students

## Years 12 to 13

Students starting in Year 12 have an initial assessment and are given a level on the CEFR which is equated to an IELTS score in speaking, listening, reading and writing.

In Years 12 and 13, these students are taught in small groups throughout the week and the lessons have four clear goals:

1. To improve students' speaking and discussion skills – particularly vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation, intonation and stress.
2. To enable students to use the English learned to participate fully in their chosen A Level lessons.
3. To help students to perform to the best of their ability in university interviews.
4. To prepare students for IELTS tests in speaking, listening, reading and writing.

# Curriculum Options for International Pupils

## Year 8

In Year 8, both German and Spanish are introduced and pupils are asked to select which one they wish to take.

## Year 9

In Year 9, Beginners Spanish is introduced and this is an option which International pupils can select if they wish.

## Year 10

If it is felt that a pupil's English is not strong enough to follow the GCSE English Language course, then they will be entered for the Cambridge English Examination course. This course is equivalent to GCSE and has been chosen to support pupils' university ambitions.

When selecting the options on offer at Year 9 and 10, the School is happy to provide advice and guidance to pupils to ensure they benefit fully from the curriculum on offer.



## The Admissions Process: Day Pupils

Admission to Loughborough Grammar School is by selection on academic merit. Parents who are considering Loughborough Grammar School for their son are encouraged to visit the School and meet the Headmaster, Mr Duncan Byrne or one of the Deputy Heads.

We suggest that a tour of the School is requested on a working day. We believe that this enables boys to gain a sense of the character and atmosphere of the School as well as viewing the facilities, talking to staff, current pupils and Sixth Form students. Boys will then be better placed to decide whether Loughborough Grammar School is a school where they feel they will be happy and thrive.

The entrance examinations for entry to **Years 6, 7 and 9** in September 2021, will be held on **Saturday 16 January 2021**. The entrance examinations for entry to **Years 8 and 10** in September 2021 usually take place at a mutually convenient time **during the Spring term**. If you would like your child to sit the entrance examinations, please complete and return the accompanying Registration Form.

## Year 6 to 10 Entry

Candidates are assessed by examinations in Mathematics, English and non-verbal reasoning. We also request a report from the candidate's current school.

We invite parents of candidates with additional needs or disabilities which may need to be considered for their entrance examinations, to discuss these needs with the School as early as possible so that appropriate adjustments can be considered. For example, a recent expert's report, an educational psychologist's report confirming dyslexia or a medical report confirming a disability, would need to be submitted to the School for consideration prior to the examinations.



## Entrance Examinations

The entrance examination consists of written papers in English and Mathematics. There will also be a non-verbal reasoning test.

### English

The ability to understand written passages is tested by means of comprehension questions. These will require, for example, the explanation of the writer's meaning, the drawing of reasonable inferences and understanding and explaining the meanings of words.

The ability to write well is tested by means of a composition. Qualities looked for are the ability to convey meaning clearly, to write in an interesting manner, and to show evidence of liveliness, originality, imagination and thoughtfulness. The use of a wide vocabulary, variety of sentence structure and a reasonable standard of spelling and punctuation will be expected.

### Mathematics

The questions are intended to test the candidates' powers of reasoning and their ability to apply mathematical concepts. Year 6, Year 7, and Year 8 candidates cannot use a calculator but they are permitted for the Year 9 and Year 10 examinations. The examinations are all based on topics in the National Curriculum.

### Non-Verbal Reasoning

There is no requirement to have experience of this type of assessment although there are books of similar tests available from most major bookshops which may be helpful.

## Year 12 Entry

We welcome enquiries from candidates interested in joining Loughborough Grammar School in Year 12. Each year about 25 boys join us for Sixth Form.


Candidates currently in Year 11 are invited to attend a Taster Morning in the Autumn term to meet students and staff as well as to sample Year 12 lessons. Tours of the School on a working day are available on request. Candidates who wish to apply for entry in September 2021 should submit a completed Registration Form. All candidates are interviewed by the Headmaster and references are requested.

Conditional offers are made based upon GCSE grades or international equivalents. Our minimum entry requirements are as follows:

A minimum of five grade 6s at GCSE including English and Maths

Grade 7 in the subjects being continued at A Level.  
In Mathematics, grade 8 is expected.

## The Admissions Process: International Candidates

Entry examination procedures for international candidates are as follows;

### Years 6 to 10

Entrance examination papers in English and Mathematics (as per Day pupils).

### Year 12

Predicted GCSE grades (or equivalent) or by examination three of the four subjects to be studied in the Sixth Form. (IELTS Level 6).

An interview, via Skype, is also conducted where English is a second language.

If it is not possible for a student to visit the School, examinations may be taken either at the student's current school, through the British Council or through the parents' appointed Agent.

Applicants from Hong Kong may also take examinations through the Hong Kong Overseas Examination Authority.

## English as a Second Language

Candidates for whom English is a second language will sit the online Cambridge Placement Test and an extended English Writing paper. The Cambridge Placement Test give a result on the Common European Framework (CEFR). We expect the following levels:

**Years 7-8:** B1

**Year 9:** B1

**Year 10:** B2

**Year 12:** B2/C1

Nevertheless, the School is flexible with these standards for boys particularly impressive in Mathematics or at interview.

### Tier 4

Loughborough Grammar School is a Tier 4 Sponsor, registered with the UKVI, which means the School can assign 'Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies' to international candidates enabling them to obtain a Tier 4 visa. The sponsor licence number is TG9YBPA92.

For entry into the School, candidates will need to apply for a Tier 4 child student visa via the new Access UK online application service. Access UK for Tier 4 may be accessed via the following link: [www.visas-immigration.service.gov.uk/apply-visa-type/tier4](http://www.visas-immigration.service.gov.uk/apply-visa-type/tier4)

The School will supply a 'Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies' reference number when the offer of a place has been accepted and the deposit has been paid.

Upon arrival at School, a Biometric Residence Permit will be issued. This is a plastic bankcard-sized card which contains a computer chip with details of the Leave to Remain. In order for the School to receive the Biometric Residence Permit for the candidate, the Alternative Collection Location code for the School will need to be entered when applying online, in the 'Alternative Location' field on the Biometric Residence Permit screen.

Loughborough Grammar School's Alternative Collection Location code is 2SC577.

The Biometric Residence Permit will be for the duration of the Course (i.e. GCSE or A Level), therefore, a new one needs to be applied for when the course is completed and before moving to a new one (i.e. moving from GCSE to A Level or from A Level to Degree).

## Schedule for Entry in September 2021

### Entrance Examinations

**Saturday 16 January 2021**

These are for Years 6, 7 and 9 entry. The entrance exams for Year 8 and Year 10 are typically taken in the Spring Term.

Prospective pupils are always welcome to spend the day at the School. This can be arranged all year round.

## Fees

Fees are reviewed annually for the following year.

### Registration Fee

The registration fee of £100 should be sent with the Registration Form. Please make payment via bank transfer, and refer to the Registration Form for the bank transfer details. Payment may also be made via cheque, payable to Loughborough Schools Foundation. **The registration fee is non-refundable.**

### Acceptance Deposit

An acceptance deposit of £300 is payable on acceptance of a place and is returned when pupils leave in accordance with the Foundation's Terms and Conditions.

## Scholarships and School Assisted Places (SAPS)

### Academic Awards

The Foundation offers a number of honorary awards for entry to Year 7 which are awarded on academic merit. All candidates are considered for these awards without the need for any further application. Scholarships are not awarded at Sixth Form.

It should be stressed that selection for awards is not affected in any way by whether or not the candidate is also applying for a full fee paying place. Academic merit is the sole criterion for scholarship awards. These have no financial value but confer considerable prestige.

### Music Awards

Music Scholarships are available at Year 7, Year 9 and Year 12. We welcome applications from both internal and external candidates; an offer of a Scholarship is conditional on gaining entry to one of the Schools in the Loughborough Schools Foundation.

Music Scholarships are available by audition in January to exceptional practical musicians, whether instrumentalists or vocalists. They provide the framework for a comprehensive partnership between the pupil and the Music department. Music Scholarships will be tenable for the duration of a pupil's time at the Loughborough Schools Foundation, subject to annual review, and comprise individually tailored support with performance practice, music theory and aural skills, unrivalled ensemble experience and full access to the Enhanced Music Programme. Scholars must be enthusiastic and able musicians, who can demonstrate their passion for the subject as well as their technical skill. They will be mentored throughout their time at School to ensure they become the best musicians that they can be.

## School Assisted Places (SAPS)

SAPS may be awarded to pupils whose parents are unable to pay the full school fees and all applicants for financial support are thus means tested as part of the application process. These awards are designed to assist those pupils who have demonstrated the potential to benefit from the education and opportunities provided by Loughborough Grammar School and who would actively contribute to the ethos and community spirit within the School. The awards are subject to review and will continue through the pupil's time at School for as long as it can be demonstrated that they are benefiting from the educational provision, and there remains a need for financial assistance.

SAPS are awarded by the Head, who will consider a number of factors before making a decision and it is important to note that the academic merit of pupils as well as the financial situation of the parents will be taken into account when considering the award. Sadly, it is not possible to offer support to all those parents whose financial circumstances warrant it.

To apply for assistance it is necessary to complete and submit, by December, an application form in advance of the entrance examinations in January. Parents should know by the end of January whether or not a place is being awarded, however the exact amount of any help offered at this stage is subject to the outcome of a home visit and to subsequent confirmation by the Head, depending on circumstances.
