In what is our 100-year anniversary of rugby at Loughborough Grammar School, it is a very special year to be able to represent and be part of the rugby here at the school this season.

We kicked off proceedings with a lovely dinner for over 150 former Loughborough Grammar rugby players, followed by our annual game against Trent. The game didn't disappoint, with several tries being scored by both teams, however unfortunately we didn't get the win. This term for the 1st XV is always tough; many of our fixtures have been against sides that have the size and quality to trouble any side at any level, let alone at U18 level.

Having had an excellent pre-season camp in Portugal, it's been a very successful season to date with some outstanding rugby played. The boys' consistency and attitude has allowed them to develop and progress across the season, and we are now in the Natwest quarter-finals of the Bowl, the furthest the school has ever gone.

Another highlight of this term is our win against our nearest rivals Nottingham High School. It was a fantastic spectacle with over 1500 spectators in attendance under the lights at Loughborough University.

The 2nd XV have kept the pressure on the 1st XV with consistent performances and some excellent wins. The good mix of Year 12 and 13s has proved to be a good balance enabling the boys to gel and develop well as a team, putting the necessary pressure on the 1st XV to keep performing.

The U16 team is also having an excellent season. They are developing and continually progressing into good rugby players. A positive attitude off the field, with the extra training in the gym is enabling them to express themselves on the rugby field, resulting in some impressive wins; a highlight being a 50-7 win vs Oakham School.

The U15As have had a good season with just a little more consistency required. However, the squad has a fantastic attitude; they are keen to progress and continue to develop as rugby players.

The U15Bs have improved immensely with two excellent wins to date. As



was the case last year, it is pleasing to see the number of boys who are new to the game of rugby and who are now established and committed to representing the school on Saturdays, and it continues to grow.

It has been a very tough season for our U14As; a side who are always training well and portray a fantastic attitude throughout. A win has certainly helped! Continued hard work and sticking together as a group is the message moving forward, as I have no doubt that there's plenty of potential in this group to develop and excel further in their rugby journey.

The U13As have been very consistent, registering some very impressive victories. Numbers are excellent and the boys continue to train well.

The girls' team from Loughborough High School and Loughborough Amherst School managed to show great teamwork and effort to place 3rd overall, with 9 schools entered. The Loughborough Grammar School boys equally showed some amazing performances and many stepping up age groups to swim against older swimmers and maximise the points for Loughborough Schools Foundation as a team. The boys along with many personal best times finished 6th out of 10 teams entered.

At the Independent Schools Association (ISA) Midlands Gala, our Amherst swimmers performed well with the highlight being Henry who finished 2nd in the Freestyle race and qualified for the National ISA for the Midlands Team in the Freestyle and Medley Relays.

Other highlights were Jessica finishing 3rd in the Year 11-13 200m Individual Medley, and Eva finishing 2nd in the Year 9-10, 100m Backstroke final. Well done to the whole team.

Next up will be some time trials at Loughborough Schools Foundation to select our best team for the Bath and Nelson cup in London, and for our Year 7 and 8s, the World School Games event; both being held at the London Olympic Aquatic centre next year. The first event will also be attended by Fairfield Prep with the best 6 boys and 6 girls being selected across Year 5 and 6 from our current selected swim academy on Tuesday lunch times.

We also had a successful Loughborough Amherst School prep swimming gala with Agnes house just coming out on top by 5 points.




The Preparatory school pupils have risen to the theme of challenge though the new concept curriculum in representing the school in a variety of sporting opportunities during the Autumn term.

Our staff work hard to promote the focus on things that are within the control of our children, such as the weight of our pass, the timing of our run, the things we say to ourselves as we stand on the block before our first dive. We often ask, "What does a great performance look like without mentioning goals or winning?" The children often come back with things that they can focus on and what they can control, ensuring that no matter the result, we are always learning and developing.

The children's growth and development has been fantastic to see this term across our major games of **hockey** and **rugby**. There have also been some excellent examples of determination in the swimming pool, on the vaults and on the **football** pitch. Every child in **Upper Prep** has had the feeling of representing the school and this is something that, as a department, we are incredibly proud of. At Prep school level, growth and maturation levels can differ immensely and it becomes important for us to provide everyone an opportunity to play and have a positive experience because, as we know, they might develop at a later stage.



During the early parts of the term, the **Year 6 girls' hockey team** progressed well, narrowly losing to an incredibly strong Bromsgrove school in the Independent Association of Prep Schools (IAPS) plate final. Our boys' **football** team endured a difficult start to their IAPS competition, losing the first 3 matches, only to come back to win the plate final on the day. After losing the first four matches of the season, the **Year 6 boys' rugby team** won three of their IAPS competition matches and have recently finished with a strong victory over Spratton Hall. We firmly believe that this progress is through focusing on the small details that are fully within our control and the majority of the children have fully embraced this.
