Anti Bullying Policy

It is bullying if you feel hurt because of things said about your ethnic background, religion, gender, sexuality, disability, special educational needs, appearance or a family issue.

Is it bullying? Persistently:

- being called names or threatened
- having rumours spread or hurtful things said about you/ your family
- being pressured into giving money/possessions
- being hit or having your possessions damaged
- being mean to you using text/ social media

- Make sure you're safe

- Keep evidence such as texts

What to say...

- What, when and where the situation happened
- Who was involved
- Who saw it happen
- What have you done already

Remember, you are not to blame for what has happened. It is better to tell someone. The school is here to help.
